Holly - Art class



Elm practiced their knife skills preparing slices of oranges, melons and lemons for the freezer, ready for this hot weather when we need a cooling snack during breaks! Post 16 learners continued practicing their chosen recipes and it was great to see them applying home cooking skills with greater independence. In Oak class, learners made Asian inspired fruit salads with home made toasted oats and blueberry compote. After the half term our next theme will be Alfresco dining! 
Swimming success!
